## Method of development of LEQ

The structure and contents of the questionnaire have been developed with the help of the following procedures:

- Compilation of a number of evidence-based learning factors from higher education pedagogy literature
- 2. Thematic analysis of prioritized learning factors in order to identify different aspects of a natural learning environment
- 3. Overarching categorization of these aspects based on the student's experience of meaningfulness, comprehensibility, and manageability in the learning environment (see footnote <sup>1</sup>)
- 4. Formulation of statements that investigate these aspects of the learning environment
- 5. Student interviews to ensure that the statements are correctly interpreted as far as possible. If required back to step 4
- 6. Quantitative investigations of the response rate to the questionnaire statements in order to identify remaining problems. If required back to step 4
