



After the summer break, we hope to return to a more normal academic year. Progress with vaccinations is certainly encouraging, but it is too soon to predict the development of the pandemic, and different scenarios need to be considered and prepared for. This subject was one of the themes discussed at the recent faculty breakfast meeting. The pedagogic quality of our courses and a sustainable workload for our teachers are the primary considerations for effective planning. The School management and the Department Directors of studies are working together to formulate a plan guided by these two principles.

The other subject discussed at the breakfast meeting was co-funding of external grants. At present we lack a general model, and it is too often the case that organising the co-funding is left to individual researchers. This is not an ideal arrangement, but finding a general solution is complicated and may limit the flexibility that we benefit from today. The School management and Department Heads will continue to discuss the question. For me, it is important that the co-funding system provides a sense of security and appreciation to our researchers. Researchers at the School are highly successful in attracting external grants. The School had a 20% increase in external funding during 2018-2020 - something I am extremely proud about!
