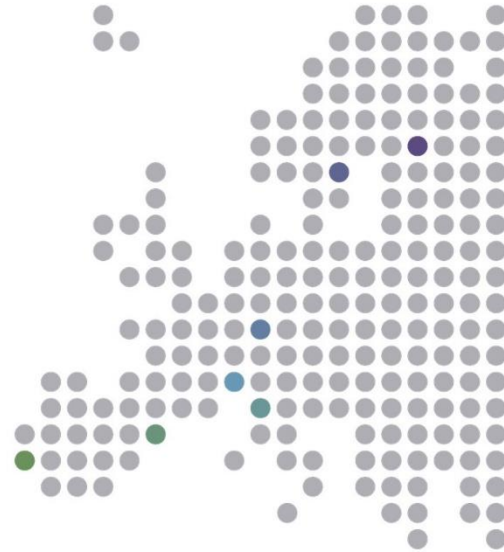




Unite! Boot Camp II

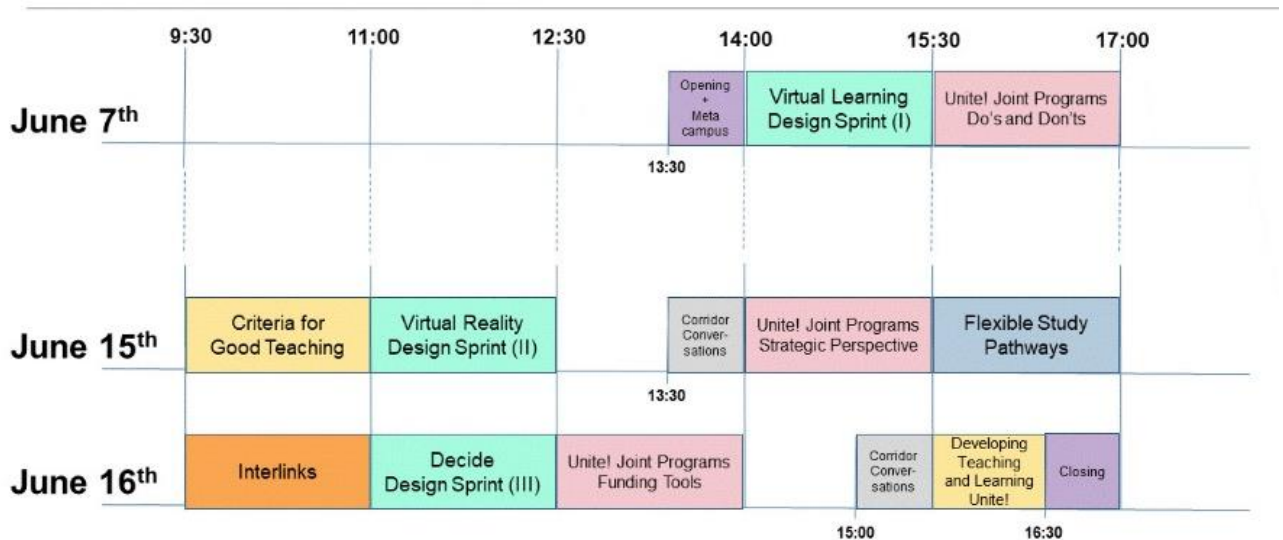
Registration

Session's layout




Unite! Metacampus

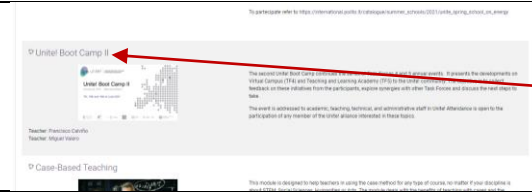

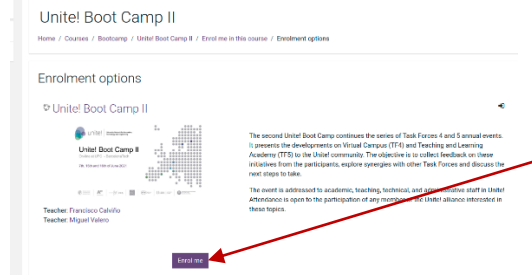
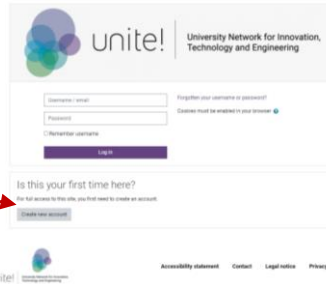
Open from 24th May to 6th June
