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
OVERVIEW

ABOUT THE CHALLENGE

Students will compete in groups of three in developing and pitching innovative project(s) that transform or enhance the Climate Action House and its surrounding area to inspire meaningful climate action. The possibilities are endless, but feasibility will be a key criterion in the judging process.

This is more than just a competition—it's a chance to reimagine how we use and manage shared spaces for sustainability, collaboration, and innovation. Whether through new ways of engaging the community and other actors, rethinking the use of materials, or integrating technology for climate action, students are encouraged to push the boundaries of what's possible.

The Climathon is organized by KTH Climate Action Centre, Akademiska Hus, and KTH Live-In Lab. Are you ready to shape the future of sustainable campus life?

How well the project engages KTH students

02 Connection to SDG 13

Promotion or contribution to/of SDG 13

03 Innovative Transformation and Use of Space

Integrating technology, spatial design, management & use

04 Practical Feasibility

Assessing how realistic the implementation is

05 Communication & Visual Impact

Incorporation of communication and artistic/visual elements to enhance the space

JUDGING SCALE

- 7 Outstanding:** The application successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the criterion in question. Shortcomings are insignificant.
- 6 Excellent:** The application successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the criterion in question. Shortcomings are minor.
- 5 Very good:** The application addresses the criterion very well, but with some notable shortcoming.
- 4 Good:** The application addresses the criterion well, but with several notable shortcomings.
- 3 Acceptable:** The application broadly addresses the criterion, but there are considerable weaknesses.
- 2 Poor:** The application addresses the criterion in an inadequate manner, or there are serious inherent weaknesses.
- 1 Insufficient:** The application fails to address the criterion or cannot be judged due to missing or incomplete information.

SAMPLE IDEAS

INTERACTIVE ART:

Creating a rotating exhibition space connected to the centre, with curated themes and connected lectures.

PASSERBY ENGAGER:

Adding a climate dashboard to the outside of the building, showing updated statistics connected to climate action.

PARK OF NATURE:

Turning the lawn into a biodiverse park with seating designed to provoke thought.

ECO-HUB:

Facilitating and hosting a series of thematic events in the centre.

CO-MANAGING SPACE:

A student-driven concept for how the space could be co-managed long-term

- Abstract
- Pitch

SELECTION PROCESS

- Kick-off with **<10 Projects**
- Panel of Jury will select a winner from the competing projects

PRIZE

- The winning team will be offered a certificate and a choice of either:
- **3 weeks' employment** and mentorship in June or August to further develop their plans
 - or a **monetary award** of 5000 SEK per person.
