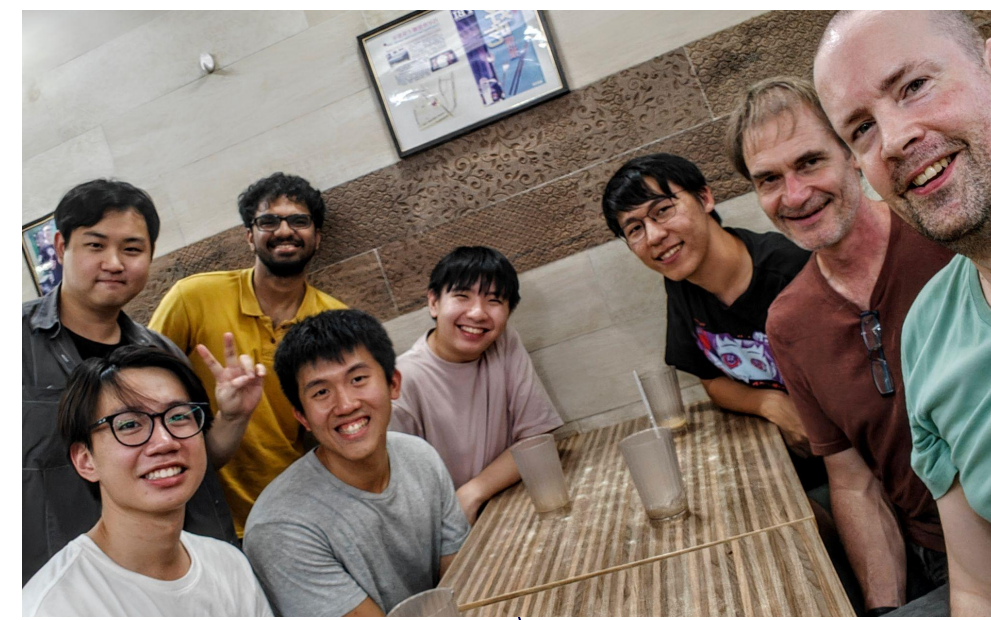

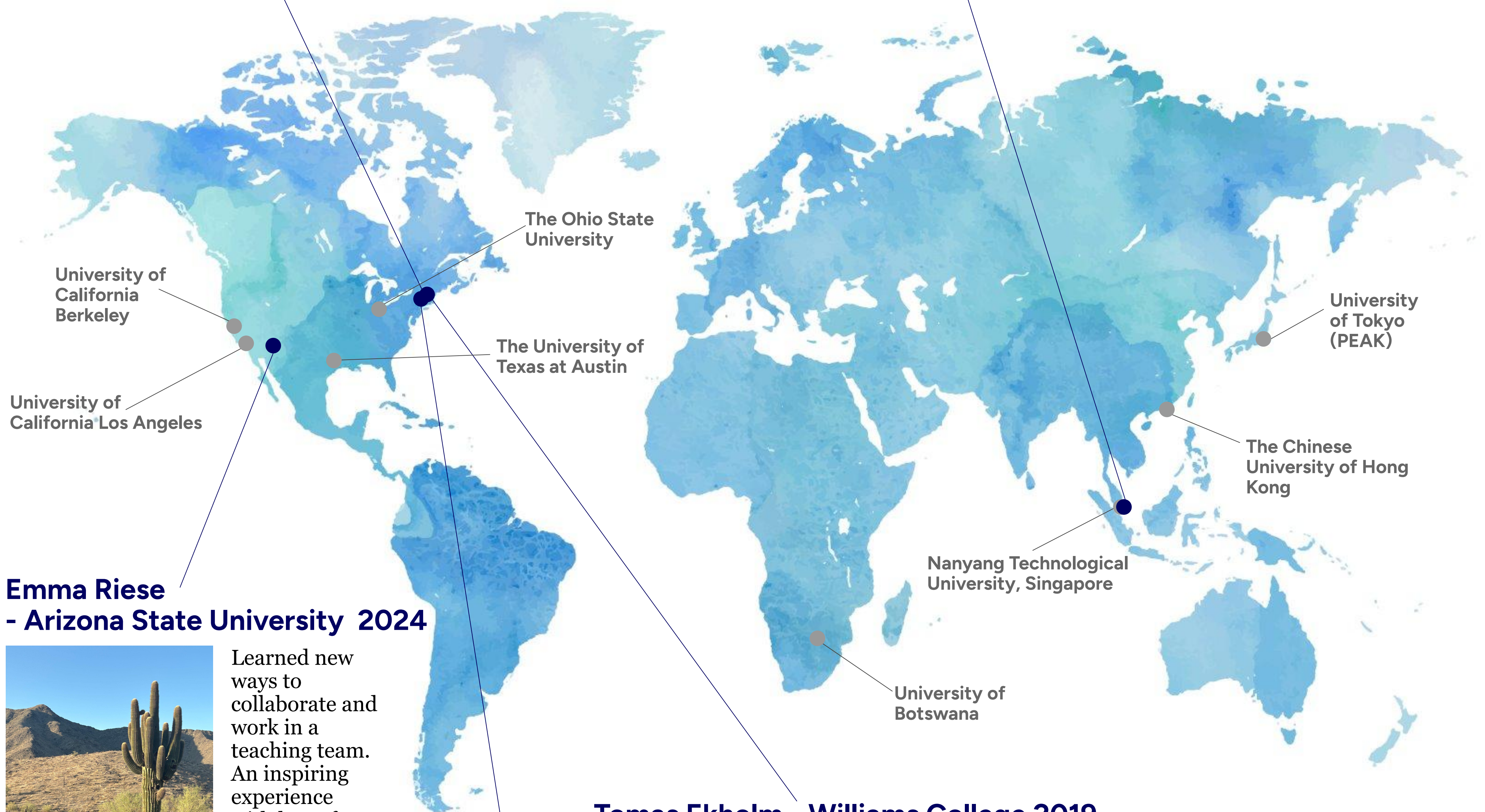


A family adventure, lifelong friends, new research area and six years later: an invitation to Stanford.
